10-Minute Play Festival

The 10 minute festival is a fairly new addition to the MTA festival. The festival is geared for high school age students who love a challenge. The festival begins with a 3 hour writing blitz in which student writers have to produce a 3 or 4 character 10 minute play. After the writers turn in their scripts, the directors have 30 minutes to cast those scripts from the remaining students and begin rehearsals. Less than 24 hours later, those shows are performed for adjudicators. This format is a great way for smaller schools to get a taste of competitive theatre.
